Free Summer Meal Program Helps District Families

Holley children received free breakfast and lunch at the MS/HS Dining Hall once again this summer due to a partnership with the U.S. Department of Agriculture. The district provided meals Monday through Friday to children age 18 and younger who lived within the Holley Central School District this summer, regardless of income level. "We were proud and pleased to offer this program in conjunction with the Department of Agriculture," said Superintendent Brian Bartalo. "We urged everyone in the district to participate." Pre-registration was not required.

While district children enjoyed these meals for free, adults, including Holley staff members, purchased breakfast for \$2.60 and lunch for \$4.35 from the district during this program.

Students who participated in the BLAST summer conditioning sessions or attended local summer recreation programs were able to grab meals before and/or after their sessions. Breakfast was served from 8-11 a.m. and lunch was served from 11 a.m.-1 p.m. Breakfast included bagels, cereal, muffins, pancakes, Frudels, fresh fruit, juice and milk. Lunch included subs, wraps, tacos, pizzas, chicken patties, salads, vegetables, fruit, water and milk. The meal program ended on August 16. Transportation was not provided by the District.

Cereal, muffins and bagels were cited as students' top choices for breakfast. Subs, wraps, pizzas and tacos were their favorites for lunch. "All the food here is good," said junior Zach Dann. "I like the people who work here, too." Broek Ostrom agrees. "I like that I don't have to make my own lunch, I can stop here instead," he said. (continued on p. 6)

Greetings Holley Community,

It's back to school time! I know that all of us at Holley Central School District are very enthusiastic to start the 2019-20 school year, and I hope that you are, too. We have a great deal to look forward to as we continue to work together to make Holley the best district it can be for our students.

There's a great deal to be proud of and excited about as we anticipate this upcoming school year. This summer, multiple teams of teachers worked on curriculum and prepared instruction to better engage our students and prepare them for bright futures. We are planning to roll out our 1:1 technology initiative this school year, and all our students in first, fifth and ninth grades will receive school-issued laptop devices. The plan is to continue with a similar "roll out" pattern for other grade levels so that in a few years, all students will have laptops. We had to stagger the yearly distribution due to budgetary and technical

limits, but this plan will be fully implemented in three years! We're excited for the new learning opportunities this initiative brings. Parents of first, fifth and ninth grade students receiving laptops will be given more detailed information from your building leaders soon.

One change for the 2019-20 school year is the selection of Holley CSD to participate in the Community Eligibility Provision (CEP) program that entitles all students to free meals at our school. Starting in the 2019-20 school year, each and every student in our district can receive a free breakfast and/or lunch on a daily basis. No paperwork is required. It's a free opportunity for our students and families, and it's something we're very excited about. Students can still bring in food from home, but if they choose a healthy school meal, it will be free, due to our district qualifying for this special program sponsored by the U.S. government.

There is also a lot of work that will go into improving our school district to best meet the needs of all our students. As a NYS "Target District," we've worked this summer on writing improvement plans designed to increase the

academic achievement of our students. This planning process has included students, teachers, parents and administrators. We reviewed data (assessment and survey) and designed goals and actions that will help us improve all facets of our instructional program. We begin implementing our plans at the start of the 2019-20 school year.

From the work of organizing our various bus runs to the upkeep of our beautiful buildings and grounds, plus the hard work we've done to prepare effective instructional practices at all levels, we are ready for a great school year! Thank you in advance for your continued support of Holley CSD. I look forward to the continued partnership of the school district and community which makes Holley a special and unique place to live, learn and work.

Holley Central School District welcomed two new employees to the district team this summer. Meghan Fox joins the district as a Human Resources Manager and Brendan Keiser is the Director of Teaching and Learning for the district. Both of them are eager to support the district's needs in their new roles.

Fox is working two days a week for Holley as the district shares the human resources services provided by Monroe 2-Orleans BOCES (BOCES 2) with the Wheatland-Chili Central School District, where she works three days each week. She will be helping with teacher certifications, hiring and

training tasks, and assisting with implementation of personnel processes. Fox was previously a Regional Certification Evaluator at Monroe One Educational Services (Monroe One BOCES) for three years, and prior to that, she was an elementary school teacher. Originally from Angelica, NY, she attended SUNY Oswego to obtain her bachelor's degree, then received her master's degree from Towson University in Maryland.

Keiser will focus on instruction and how students learn to make sure the Holley curriculum is being aligned correctly to meet those needs. "He will be our leader that focuses on academic achievement and growth needs," said Superintendent Brian Bartalo. "I want to be the partner for teachers, administrators, families and students to meet their goals for an incredible educational experience," said Keiser. "I realize that the district is the heart of the community and I want to be a part of that. My plan is to be visible with stakeholders and build relationships with them. I'm here to support the district's improvement plans. I want to make sure

the curriculum and instruction are rigorous and highly engaging. I want students to be actively engaged in their learning and really own it." He encourages community members to reach out to him with any questions or ideas for community partnerships. Keiser was previously a Coordinator for Curriculum and Professional Development for Cattaraugus-Allegany BOCES, where he delivered professional development opportunities to 21 component school districts and worked as the Curriculum Coordinator for the Franklinville Central School District for three-and-a-half years. Prior to that, he was a middle school and high school ELA teacher in the Salamanca City Central School District for eight-and-a-half years. Originally from Long Island, he attended SUNY Fredonia to obtain his bachelor's degree, then received his master's degree from Edinboro University and his administrative certification from Stony Brook University.

We look forward to their professional expertise in helping the district meet their goals for the 2019-20 school year.

Back to School Night: We are welcoming many new staff members to the building; please join us for Back to School Night on Sept. 3 so you have a chance to meet everyone! As we did last year, Back to School Night will start at 5:30 p.m. with a 20-minute pep assembly in the Intermediate Gym. We can't wait to celebrate the return of our students and families!

2019-20 School Year Important Arrival and Dismissal Information: Elementary students can arrive at school as early as 8:15 a.m. for breakfast. The first bell rings at **8:40 a.m.** and the second bell rings at **8:45 a.m.**, with the Pledge of Allegiance and announcements immediately following. If you want to walk your child to their class, you must sign in at the Attendance window and receive a visitor's pass. Dismissal time is 3:20 p.m. If a change needs to be made to your child's normal dismissal routine, you must send in a note requesting that change. New people who pick up students will be asked to show ID. **Changes to your child's dismissal routine must be received before 2:30 p.m. each day.** For the safety and well-being of our students, **change requests received after 2:30 p.m. will not be honored.** The Elementary School staff work diligently to keep our students safe, and change requests received after 2:30 p.m. create confusion and chaos. Your cooperation and understanding are greatly appreciated as we continue to keep every child accounted for at all times.

You can continue to access your child's assignments through the SchoolTool Parent Portal at any time throughout the year.

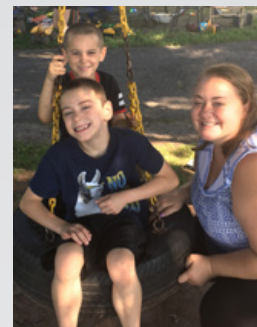

ES Staff Meet Kindergarteners on Their Home Turf

This summer, members of the Elementary School staff participated in an outreach effort to welcome kindergarteners and their families to the Elementary School. Members of the teaching team, support staff and administration traveled in small groups



to visit incoming students in their homes. While students did not necessarily meet their assigned kindergarten teacher, they met members of the team, which included four teachers, three teacher's aides, the principal, the assistant principal, the elementary social worker and counselor. Their goal was to introduce students to members of the school community and provide resources so that students starting school in September would recognize friendly faces, ensuring a smoother transition to a full day of school. They also hoped to form a stronger connection with parents to help increase parental involvement in each student's education.

Earlier this summer, families were mailed a letter inviting them to contact the Main Office to set appointments for their home visits. The team worked together to create goodie bags for every student. Each string bag was filled with a t-shirt for the student, a folder with forms to be completed for this school year, a parent handbook and a student workbook. These bags were brought to every home visit and reviewed with families. The groups also collected information about incoming students during each visit.

Each kindergarten outreach group also tried to drop in on families who had not set an appointment; this method helped groups meet several more families. For those that were not at home, a door hanger was left behind with information on how to schedule a visit. This tactic worked to elicit responses from those they had not previously been able to reach. Overall, outreach groups were able to meet with 90 percent of kindergarteners and their families.

Teams reported they felt welcomed by families during their visits. Feedback received from families was positive, with many responding that they were impressed the elementary school staff cared enough to visit students at home.

Middle School/High School (MS/HS) Update

I am especially excited to welcome everyone back to this new school year. There are so many great things that happen regularly in our school; we have plans for improvements that will help us be our best yet. We look forward to working TOGETHER to make this a very successful year for everyone.

We are looking forward to an exciting school year. The first day of school for students is Sept. 4. First period begins at 7:30 a.m. and period 9 ends at 2:24 p.m. On the first day of school, students will attend every class.

Back to School night is scheduled for Tuesday, Sept. 3 from 5:30-7 p.m. The format for the evening is changing this year. A packet of information, including students' schedules and locker assignments, was sent out Aug. 20; please contact the school if you have not yet received this information.

We have reorganized our building so that MS students (grades 7-8) have all of their classes in the 200 hallway and HS students (grades 9-12) have the majority of their classes in the 100 hallway. We will continue to explore ways to expand opportunities for MS students to transition successfully from the elementary school to high school. We welcome Matt Hennard, teacher on special assignment (TOSA), to his new role as the MS coordinator overseeing some of the MS initiatives.

The code of conduct and attendance policy have been revised, and they are posted on the district website (<http://www.holleycsd.org/CodeofConduct.aspx>). Attendance and punctuality in school continues to be stressed, beginning on the very first day. Please make sure that your students are in school each day and arrive with time to get to their first period classes. Students' attendance in school directly impacts students' achievements.

The cell phone and electronic policy had a major change made to it for **students in grades 7-8**; cell phones will not be used at any time during the school day. **Electronic devices need to be stored in backpacks prior to students departing from school busses and vehicles; when leaving school, devices must not be removed from backpacks until students are on school busses or in vehicles.**

For students in grades 9-12, the cell phone and electronic policy remains the same. Students will clearly know when it is OK and when it is not OK to use cell phones and electronics by a red, yellow and green light policy. Red symbolizes no use, yellow symbolizes use with teacher permission and green means free to use. A reminder that students who refuse to give up their devices when asked will stay for an extended detention until 5 p.m.

TOGETHER ... Respect, Responsibility and Safety will continue as a common theme this school year throughout the district. It is our expectation that our entire school community respect themselves and others. For all of us to be safe, you must be responsible and accept the responsibility that is given to you. In our ever-changing world, people who possess and understand those qualities will be ready to take on daily challenges, while also being productive citizens in their communities.

Regular communication is always encouraged. It is important for you to have open communication with all members of the school community. Please do not hesitate to contact teachers, staff and administration with any questions, comments or suggestions. Please utilize the district website to obtain the most updated information regarding school and the programs available.

Please make sure that you utilize our student management system, SchoolTool. If you have registered in the past, your account is still active. If you have not used the system before, please register for access to your student's grades, schedule, attendance and discipline information. Our interim reports are not mailed home, but they are available on SchoolTool. Visit the district website for more information.

It is my hope that TOGETHER all students, parents and community members take pride in their entire school program. Best wishes for a productive and enjoyable school year.

School Bus Safety Reminders

Did you know that an estimated 50,000 motor vehicles illegally pass New York State school buses every day? Don't become one of them! In New York State, it is illegal to pass a bus when its red lights are flashing. When drivers see the red lights flashing, they must come to a complete stop at least 20 feet away from the bus so that the bus driver can pick up or discharge students. This rule applies even when a bus has its red lights flashing in a parking lot, on school grounds, on a multi-lane highway or on the opposite side of a divided highway. Drivers must stop, whether they are approaching the bus from the front or the rear. When the red lights stop flashing or when the bus driver signals, drivers may resume driving. Drivers must yield to flashing yellow lights on a bus, slow down and be prepared to stop.



Penalties for passing a school bus involve fines, points added to your license and possible jail time. Refer to the table below.

| By Conviction | Minimum Fine | Maximum Fine | Possible Imprisonment |
|--|--------------|--------------|-----------------------|
| First Conviction | \$250 | \$400 | Up to 30 days |
| Second Conviction (within 3 years) | \$600 | \$750 | Up to 180 days |
| Third or Subsequent Convictions (within 3 years) | \$750 | \$1,000 | Up to 180 days |

Safe Riding Rules

Be Respectful

- Keep hands and feet to yourself.
- Keep noise level down and use respectful language.

Be Responsible

- Keep the aisle clear at all times.
- Be at your stop at least five minutes early and ready to load the bus.
- Boarding of authorized passengers at authorized stops is allowed; unauthorized passengers are not allowed.
- Eating and/or drinking are **not allowed** on the bus.

Be Safe

- Remain in your assigned seat **at all times** until the bus is stopped.
- Wait for the driver's signal before crossing at least 10 feet in front of the bus.
- Go back to where you started if you hear the horn while loading/unloading from the bus.
- Wear headphones or earbuds while using electronic devices. **Remove them** while loading/unloading from the bus for your safety.

Holley Athletes Had a BLAST This Summer

The BLAST program (Biomechanical Learning And Stability Training) returned to Holley MS/HS this summer to help student athletes in grades 7-12 stay conditioned for sports. Athletic trainers from LeRoy Physical Therapy & Village Fitness led the free hour and a half sessions, held three times a week for five weeks. Students worked on their speed, core strength, flexibility, balance, muscular strength and endurance. Each week, they completed cardio workouts on the track and used weights in the gym. At the end of each week, students completed a light workout and then played active games, such as tag, kickball, four square and dodgeball. The workouts became more challenging as the summer session progressed.

While sessions averaged about six students in attendance, middle school and high school athletes were represented equally in most sessions. Cross country runners, cheerleaders and soccer players participated in the BLAST program. Many of the soccer players enjoyed the drills during the BLAST workouts as these drills will help them prepare for similar team drills in the fall. Eighth grade soccer player Brenden Trowbridge said he enjoyed the weight room workouts. "It's helped me work on my core and increase my arm strength," he said. Senior Mikaela Auch, a cross country runner, attended the sessions to help her with conditioning for her upcoming season. "This program teaches you to work together as a team," she said.

This summer session for Holley students was offered as part of the district's athletic training contract with LeRoy Physical Therapy.

Parent Priscilla Church brought her daughters for breakfast and lunch regularly. "The girls enjoy it, and I like that they have fruit and vegetables with their meals," she said. "It helps me save money because the girls are eating food they like and we're not wasting any." Dana Harner, who has nine kids, agreed with the cost savings. "I like that there are no financial requirements to participate in this program," she said. "My kids are eating nutritious food and I'm not spending a fortune to do that. They like having their meals made to order."

John DiLorenzo brings his son in for lunch after he attends the summer recreation program. "It saves me time before I head in to work," he said. "My son can have a good lunch and it's less I have to worry about." Jennifer Schmidt appreciates the convenience

of having this program in the community. "My kids like coming and visiting with their friends," she said. "I don't mind bringing them here." Amanda Fallato incorporates stopping in for lunch as part of her family's activities. "We ride bikes here," she said. "It gets us all out of the house. They have more choices for lunch than I can offer at home, and I don't have to make as many meals."

Food service worker Pam Coopenberg said the busiest days of the meal program were Tuesdays and Wednesdays when the summer recreation program was in session. On average, 492 meals were served each week. Lunches proved more popular than breakfasts, with a total of 1,513 lunches served versus 1,436 breakfasts at the end of six weeks of summer meals.

OppU Achievers Scholarship

To apply for the OppU Achievers Scholarship, submit a short essay responding to the prompted question. Winners for the OppU Achievers Scholarship are selected four times a year. To be eligible for the OppU Achievers Scholarship, a student must: be enrolled full-time in high school or at least part-time in college, graduate, professional or trade school and possess a cumulative GPA of at least 3.0/4.0. American Muscle Student Scholarship Program

Refer to it often for everything from Board of Education meeting minutes to school lunch menus, athletic schedules, homework assignments, news and more. Holley Students in Grades Pre-K-12 Will Have Free School Meals in 2019-20 School Year

During the 2019-20 school year, all Holley students in grades Pre-K-12 will receive free breakfasts and lunches while school is in full-day session. Holley Central School District (HCSD) was approved by the New York State Education Department to participate in the Community Eligibility Provision (CEP) program beginning this school year. Schools that are in high poverty areas that currently participate in the School Breakfast and National School Lunch Programs are eligible for the CEP program. HCSD will be in the CEP program for four successive school years.

On half days, upon request, Take Home Bag Lunches will be offered at no charge. **Lunches must be preordered**; order forms will be sent home with elementary students the week prior to each early dismissal day.

Students may still purchase a la carte items, such as chips, ice cream, cookies, etc. Such items may not be charged. Visit the Food Services Department page <http://www.holleycsd.org/FoodServices.aspx> for more information on a la carte pricing and monthly menus.

There is no free and reduced price meal application required this year.
