School Bus Safety Reminders

Did you know that an estimated 50,000 motor vehicles illegally pass New York State school buses every day? Don't become one of them! In New York State, it is illegal to pass a bus when its red lights are flashing. When drivers see the red lights flashing, they must come to a complete stop at least 20 feet away from the bus so that the bus driver can pick up or discharge students. This rule applies even when a bus has its red lights flashing in a parking lot, on school grounds, on a multi-lane highway or on the opposite side of a divided highway. Drivers must stop, whether they are approaching the bus from the front or the rear. When the red lights stop flashing or when the bus driver signals, drivers may resume driving. Drivers must yield to flashing yellow lights on a bus, slow down and be prepared to stop.



Penalties for passing a school bus involve fines, points added to your license and possible jail time. Refer to the table below.

By Conviction	Minimum Fine	Maximum Fine	Possible Imprisonment
First Conviction	\$250	\$400	Up to 30 days
Second Conviction (within 3 years)	\$600	\$750	Up to 180 days
Third or Subsequent Convictions (within 3 years)	\$750	\$1,000	Up to 180 days

Safe Riding Rules

Be Respectful

- Keep hands and feet to yourself.
- Keep noise level down and use respectful language.

Be Responsible

- Keep the aisle clear at all times.
- Wear face mask before entering bus, and while riding and exiting bus.
- Sit in assigned seat.
- Be at your stop at least five minutes early and ready to load the bus.
- Boarding of authorized passengers at authorized stops is allowed; unauthorized passengers are not allowed.
- Eating and/or drinking are **not allowed** on the bus.

Be Safe

- Remain in your assigned seat at all times until the bus is stopped.
- Wait for the driver's signal before crossing at least 10 feet in front of the bus.
- Go back to where you started if you hear the horn while loading/unloading from the bus.
- Wear headphones or earbuds while using electronic devices. **Remove them** while loading/unloading from the bus for your safety.

Holley Students in Grades K-12 Have Free School Meals Again This School Year

During the 2020-21 school year, all Holley students in grades Pre-K-12 will receive free breakfasts and lunches. This includes students who are remote learning from home. Holley Central School District (HCSD) was approved by the New York State Education Department to participate in the Community Eligibility Provision (CEP) program beginning in the 2019-20 school year. Schools that are in high poverty areas that currently participate in the School Breakfast and National School Lunch Programs are eligible for the CEP program. HCSD will be in the CEP program for four successive school years, ending at the conclusion of the 2022-23 school year. Students may still purchase a la carte items, such as chips, ice cream, cookies, etc. Such items may not be charged. - Connect-Ed this electronic messaging system is how we tell you about breaking news that is urgent in nature and may require your immediate attention. For this reason, it is important that we have your current phone number and/or email address. If your number or address has changed or if you haven't provided this information previously, please be sure to do so now. Simply call your child's school and tell us your current number and address.
- SchoolTool this is our student management system which allows parents to see student information online, including student schedules, attendance, interim and report card grades, discipline information, and more. If you have not already registered with SchoolTool, do so today at http://www.holleycsd.org/SchoolTool.aspx. You will find a sign-up form on the website that you will need to complete and return to your child's school. You only need to register once to have access to this secure online system. If you have registered in the past and your email address remains the same, no further action is required; you still have access to this site.
- Website the district website (http://www.holleycsd.org/default.aspx) is a comprehensive and continually updated resource for parents and residents alike. Refer to it often for everything from Board of Education meeting minutes to school lunch menus, athletic schedules, news and more. There is a change in the address for where school tax payments can be made this year. Tax payments can be made in person at the Holley Central School District Office - Lockbox, located at 3800 North Main Street, Holley, NY 14470. Payments can also be mailed to this address. Make checks payable to Holley Central School District.

October 1 through October 31: Pay full amount plus 2% penalty.

On **November 1**, taxes revert to the county and are no longer payable through the school district.

Scholarships

Feel free to review these scholarships and pay particular attention to the deadline dates. Listen for scholarship announcements and drop by the Counseling Office for information starting in mid-December. Also, consider visiting www.fastweb.com for national scholarship searches. Don't wait until March or April – you might be out of luck!

SENIORS should now be narrowing their search on colleges they'd like to attend. They should register to take the **SAT and/or ACT** sometime in the fall. Online registration is available for the SAT at www.collegeboard.org and for the ACT at https://www.act.org/content/act/en/products-and-services/the-act.html. Seniors should be working on their college applications and aim to complete them by Thanksgiving. Check the application deadline of each college you are applying to, as they may differ. When requesting letters of recommendation from teachers as part of the college application process, please allow them ample time to complete them. Students are encouraged to register with each college's Educational Opportunity Program (EOP). More information will be given to juniors and seniors in regards to eligibility for EOP. Any questions, please contact each college directly.

JUNIORS that plan on attending a four-year college: the SATs/ACTs are required for admission at many colleges. Check and see if any of them have waived this requirement due to tests being canceled during the COVID-19 pandemic. If needed, please register for these exams! Students should contact their counselors with any questions.
