Seniors planning on attending college next Fall should have applied to college and completed the FAFSA (Free Application for Federal Student Aid) by now. It is not too late if you have not. Please remember to save your passwords/login information when filling out college applications or the FAFSA on-line. Also, be sure to tell your counselor where you applied so they can send out your transcript and/or complete any part of you application if needed.

The Excelsior Scholarship in combination with other student financial aid programs, allows students to attend a SUNY college tuition-free. The program covers tuition for eligible SUNY students. The application for the 2023-24 application (attendance in the Fall 2023 semester) will be available 5/23. If you are in 11th grade and are planning on going to college after high school, it is recommended to visit the college campuses you are interested in. You can visit in person or virtually. You can take a campus tour, attend an open house, informational session or make an individual appointment. It is best to do this during the Spring of this year to help narrow down the list of colleges you will be applying to next Fall during your senior year.

The Genesee Promise Plus program allows any 11th grade or graduating 12th grade student to take up to two college classes during the summer for free (not including books). The application deadline is June 16, 2023. • May 18th: Fostering Resilient Learners: Parenting and the Brain - 6-7pm, virtual via Zoom

- In this engaging, relevant, and practical session, learn from Kristin Souers (lead author of the best-selling and award-winning Fostering Resilient Learners: Strategies for creating a trauma-sensitive classroom - ASCD, 2016 and Relationship, Regulation, and Responsibility: Trauma Invested Practices for Fostering Resilient Learners-ASCD, 2019) about the importance of taking care of ourselves and our children.
- The goal of this parent night is to enhance the adult-child relationship. In this class, parents and other adult caregivers (grandparents, aunts, uncles, coaches, child care providers, teachers, foster parents, etc.) will learn practical skills for how to engage children and teens, use effective communication, and gain an understanding of how stress can impact brain development and learning.

- This forum is designed for families to learn about the district's priority with creating a welcoming and affirming environment for all students. We recognize that when students see themselves in their curriculum; are engaged in relevant instruction to their lives, experiences, and interests; and feel welcomed and a part of their school, they will be successful academically, socially and emotionally.
- Come check out artifacts and engage in conversations with different stakeholders to learn what equity work actually looks like in our district.
