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Mental Health Minute

Planning for life after high school can be difficult. Navigating through some of these plans can be confusing and overwhelming. We wanted to share some information that may help. Seniors should continue to apply to college and complete their FAFSA before winter break. Many colleges are free to apply to and others waive their application fee. Be sure to check their website to see what they offer. New York Higher Education Services Corporation offers a lot of financial aid information and scholarship opportunities. The Excelsior Scholarship, in combination of other student financial aid programs, allows students to attend a SUNY or CUNY school tuition free. The program covers tuition for eligible students of families who earned \$125,000 or less per year in the tax year 2020.

As of now, most colleges are test optional which means it won't count against an admissions decision if they haven't taken or don't take the SAT and/or ACT. If you are unsure of something or need help applying to college, please contact the counseling office or the college you are applying to. We do not know if colleges will stay test optional. If you are a junior, you may want to take the SAT or ACT in the Spring or again if needed in the fall of your senior year. It is best to continue to check with the counseling office or the college you are interested in applying to in case any application requirements change. If you are just starting high school, it is very important to take challenging courses throughout high school. If colleges stay test optional, your high school transcript will be weighed heavily when a college makes decisions on who to admit. Get involved in and out of school. Write down what you do and when you do it. By the time you are a senior, you should have a list of activities you have participated in. You will be asked to list what you have done on your college application or resume. Being able to maintain good grades while being involved in and/or out of school will show an admissions representative that you are a good candidate for their school.
