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A Message from the Superintendent



Greetings Holley!

The first month of our school year has come and gone, and we're well on our way to another great year! We have a lot of exciting things happening, and I'm pleased that

you're reading this month's Dimension to see all that's going on in our district. I encourage you to continue to check out our district website, follow us on Twitter and read each issue of the Dimension.

As I've highlighted previously, all of our students can receive free breakfasts and lunches at school daily, with no required paperwork. The Holley Central School District was approved by the New York State Education Department to participate in the Community Eligibility Provision (CEP) program beginning this school year. Schools that are in high poverty areas that currently participate in the School Breakfast and National School Lunch Programs are eligible for the CEP program. We feel fortunate that all our students continue to have access to nutritious meals at school at no cost to our families. I want to encourage everyone to participate in this program; I'm happy to see our participant

numbers increase as we rollout this program for the first time. As a reminder, upon request for half days of school, **Take Home Bag Lunches** will be offered at no charge. **Lunches must be preordered;** order forms will be sent home with elementary students the week prior to each early dismissal day. We look forward to continuing to serve our students in this way!

We are excited about many other initiatives in our district this year. We have rolled out our 1:1 technology program, and currently our fifth and ninth grade students are using their own school-issued laptops. Our first graders are set to receive their devices next. At this time, our ninth graders are the only students who bring their devices home. We have plans to expand our 1:1 rollout, possibly providing a device to each 10th grader this year based on our available inventory. It's an exciting time for teaching and learning, with these brand new devices in the hands of our students and staff.

We have been focused on our middle school this year, and we have made some changes to address the specific needs of this important age group of students. Matt Hennard is a "teacher on special assignment" (TOSA), and he is our Middle School Coordinator. He is supporting all seventh and eighth grade students and staff. We have put in

place some changes such as new expectations (e.g., no cell phone use during the day for middle school students), and moving our middle level students to the same hallway. Our middle level teachers will be meeting throughout the year to address the academic, social and emotional needs of this specific age group of students.

Our Elementary School is engaging in a new "Positivity Project" that is addressing many social and emotional aspects of our students. It is aimed at creating a very positive and productive culture and learning environment. The Elementary School is also involved in a "One School One Book" project. Everyone in the school community (including faculty, staff and family members) is reading the same novel, and sharing experiences and lessons from it. It's been a huge success so far! If you haven't gotten a copy yet, pick up "The Adventures of a South Pole Pig," by Chris Kurtz, and read along with us!

Thanks for your continued support of the Holley Central School District.

School Supply Donations Happily Received

Holley Central School District was the recipient of several donations of school supplies from local groups. St. Mary's and St. Mark's Churches, working with the Holley Community Center, donated 20 full backpacks to specific families who have students in Pre-K-grade 12. They researched what each child at each grade level would need and provided all of the school supplies. Several local Holley businesses collaboratively donated 60 backpacks and over \$1,000 in school supplies for students. "We received six cases of tissues alone," said ES Principal Karri Schiavone. "These local businesses were able to band together to give us pallets of supplies. It's wonderful!"

For the second year, Bonduelle USA Inc. donated 12 backpacks full of school supplies for students. They paired each backpack with a Webkinz stuffed animal that coordinated with the style of the backpack. Principal Schiavone will roll these backpacks out to students who join the ES throughout the year. "The Webkinz are such a welcoming gesture to new students," she said. "They find such comfort in having a new 'friend' at Holley."
